We would like to share with you a few pictures and a few words to tell you the beautiful thing that happened in our Tuesday night service several weeks ago.

After several songs, the children began to pray in such a beautiful and spontaneous way. God is truly a Father to the fatherless (Psalm 68:5) and that evening many of the children were having a good talk with their "Papa". They were forgiving their families for their abandonment and rejection and being healed of their hurts inside.

We all felt a special atmosphere of God's presence as the children poured out their hearts allowing God to fill their hearts back up with the truth.

Joel 2:28

...I will pour out my Spirit on all people...In the last days your sons and daughters will have dreams and visions...

Myra was placed at another orphanage because of the abandonment from her mother who preferred alcohol and the party life to being a mother to her children. When she and her brothers were taken from that orphanage and brought to us, you could see the sadness, rejection, and lack of peace in her face because of the lack of stability in her life at such an early age.

The rejection from her mother and having to jump from orphanage to orphanage created such pain and lack of consistency in her life that we ourselves were not able to reach her because of the wall of protection that she built. But this particular evening that wall came down and God was able to pour His love out on her.

Here we also see Andrea a double victim of rejection from her mother and father. Andrea had so much pain in her heart that she used to scream at the top of her lungs at the smallest inconvenience. For example, another child butting in front of her in line would make her very angry.

This night she also was healed and received the love of her heavenly "Papa". By the way, she doesn't scream anymore.

Our other daughter Lupita we see on her knees in the middle of the praise team receiving the love of her "Father". Lupita's pain came from a father who abandoned her, a mother who chose a life of drugs and prostitution

to make an “easy buck”, and many brothers and sisters who abandon her in order to follow their mother’s lifestyle. We see in the photo that Lupita is breaking free from the destructive lifestyle that goes back so many generations in her family.

Your prayers and financial support make possible nights like this. Of course our Lord, God, is the one who does the healing and the changing but your support makes it possible. Thank you very much.

Don’t forget to keep praying for our extension in the mountains of Guachochi. We are making great progress toward a permanent home where the Indian children in the mountains can also receive healing and love.
