Myra relished the love everyone gave to her and quickly began to change. She started bringing A’s on all her tests. She began smiling and hugging us, basking in our love and praise.

A few days after her arrival, her life story spilled out in tears. As we listened, she told us that both her parents had died one year prior in a gasoline

explosion. Her parents were involved in illicit activity with gasoline. Myra also shared that her father sexually abused her. As she cried and prayed, she forgave her father. The Lord’s love began to bring healing to her heart.

#### *Prayer Requests*

*Mama Rosa’s health, that God would protect all her joints.*

Shortly thereafter, her grandmother came to visit. They ran to each other and embraced on another. They went out to visit for a few hours. They returned all hugs and smiles. This new love of grandmother and granddaughter is a double miracle from God. Myra continues to live with us but visits her grandmother from time to time.

We ministered to Myra and shared how Jesus forgave us from the cross and wants us to forgive one another.


Myra not only forgave her grandmother, but also her father, and mother for not listening to her cry as the father mistreated her.
